The Department of Literature, Philosophy, and the Arts (LPA) at the University of Michigan-Dearborn offers courses and programs in English and American literature, philosophy, art history, applied art, music, and music history. FACULTY & THE CLASSROOM

All bachelor's, master's, doctoral and professional degree programs are designed and led by highly qualified and engaged faculty, not teaching assistants. Classes are small—undergraduate lectures average 24 students and the student/faculty ratio is 15:1. Whatever your course of study, you'll get plenty of personal attention and support.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Students must submit an application and transcripts from any and every college/university they have attended
- A minimum of 24 transferable credit hours and a minimum posted grade point average (GPA) of 2.50.
- A student with less than 24 transferable credit hours may still be considered for transfer, but will be required to submit their final, official high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores for review.

TRANSFER GUIDELINES

- A maximum of 62 community college credits may be applied to CASL degree programs.
- Courses with a grade of C- or below do not transfer for credit.

MICHIGAN TRANSFER AGREEMENT (MTA) AND DEARBORN DISCOVERY CORE (DDC))

The Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) facilitates the transfer of general education requirements from a Michigan community college to a university degree. When a student transfers to UM-Dearborn, the MTA will be applied to the Dearborn Discovery Core (DDC), a campus-wide general education program. The chart below shows which DDC categories are met by the MTA and which ones remain. Students should check with their community college to determine which courses can be used to fulfill the MTA categories and learn the details for obtaining an MTA endorsement on their transcript. **Students transferring to UM-Dearborn must have the** *Michigan Transfer Agreement Satisfied* designation posted on their transcript to take advantage of the MTA. Students who do not complete the entire MTA, or complete courses in addition to the MTA, will receive a course by course evaluation of those courses.
