HOW TO APPLY

- Submit an application
- Submit transcripts from any and every college/university attended. A student with less than 24 transferable credit hours may be required to submit their final, official high school transcript for review.
- Visit umdearborn.edu/admissions to find the online application and application deadlines.

TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS & GUIDELINES

- A maximum of 62 community college credits may be applied to CASL degree programs.
- Admission is based on a student's posted GPA. CASL programs require a minimum 2.50 posted GPA.
- Courses with a grade of C- or below do not transfer for credit.

MICHIGAN TRANSFER AGREEMENT (MTA) AND DEARBORN DISCOVERY CORE (DDC)

The Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) facilitates the transfer of general education requirements from a Michigan community college to a university degree. When a student transfers to UM-Dearborn, the MTA will be applied to the Dearborn Discovery Core (DDC), a campus-wide general education program. The chart below shows which DDC categories are met by the MTA and which ones remain. Students should check with their community college to determine which courses can be used to fulfill the MTA categories and learn the details for obtaining an MTA endorsement on their transcript. **Students transferring to UM-Dearborn must have the** *Michigan Transfer Agreement Satisfied* designation posted on their transcript to take advantage of the MTA. Students who do not complete the entire MTA, or complete courses in addition to the MTA, will receive a course by course evaluation of those courses.
