Admission Information

1) Agreement Requirements

- To be awarded the benefits of this articulation agreement, students must complete all requirements at Schoolcraft College for the AAS, CRJ and the Michigan Transfer Agreement, prior to their first semester at UM-Dearborn.
- Both the degree and MTA Satisfied notation must be posted on their final official transcript.

2) Admission Requirements

- Detailed information can be found on the [Apply as a Transfer Student website](#).
- Submission of an application and transcripts from every college/university attended.
- Transfer students with less than 24 completed college credits must also provide their high school transcripts.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50

3) Transfer Policies

- Courses must be completed with a minimum grade of C to be accepted for transfer.
- A minimum of 30 credits must be completed to earn a degree at UM-Dearborn.

- It is the responsibility of the student to be aware of changes that affect transferring. Students are encouraged to review the transfer guide requirements on an annual basis.
